# Remembering Milly

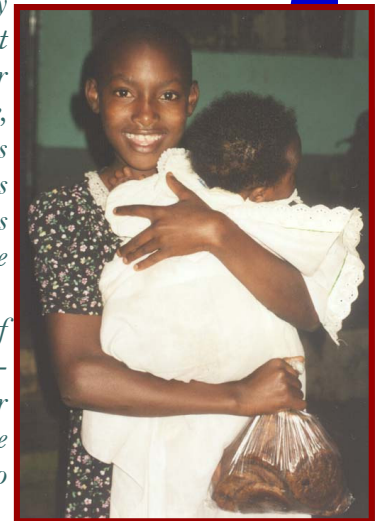
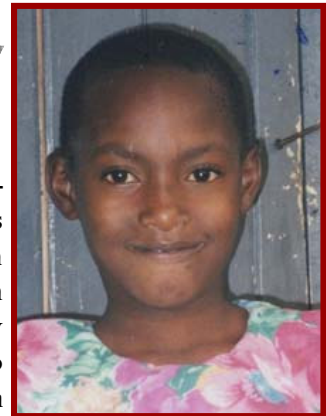
Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Did you ever have to tell someone something but have a great deal of difficulty? Well, this newsletter, Brothers and Sisters, we are in such a position. It is with sadness that we tell you of the physical death but spiritual glorification of our dear spiritual daughter Milly Nalukenge. She was born with Aids, as her mother and father died of the disease. She had been suffering greatly over the months of May and June and had been in and out of the hospital often. She was the youngest of the adopted nine (9) children of Pastor Sam and Zoe. It was truly a blessing that

our Brothers and Sisters of Seven Rivers Presbyterian Church were able to be there in Uganda when Milly passed on to glory to comfort Pastor Sam and Zoe. Upon learning of her death on the morning of Tuesday, June 27<sup>th</sup> we passed on this message to Sam and Zoe. They told us later it was shared at the grave site of our dear little Milly.

*“Thank you for the news of Milly as we have been praying for God’s grace and mercy on her. It is, of course, of great comfort to know that she is now in the arms of her Redeemer with no more pain, tears or fears anymore. She was loved by all to the very end. As we have been thinking recently of this upcoming moment, which seemed very probable, our thoughts go back to the very first time we met little Milly in July of 1995 on our first Mission trip visiting our soon to be adopted home, Uganda. She, with James and Nathaniel, were always at the church speaking to us in Rutoro and of course we fell in love with them.*

*She, being one of Sam and Zoe’s children, became one of our children for we were adopted into the Kasule family and she also*



became one of the Good Samaritan children. We have watched her grow and play and interact with all the other children of Busoro and nobody did not love "Milly Milly," as we affectingly called her, she suffered with the Aids virus but she suffered also as we all do with a worse virus, the sin virus which we all suffer from. She suffered so much more than many of us have but not as much as her Savior. For she is now cured, she is healed with the greatest and only serum that will cure the sin virus, the blood of Jesus. She knows Jesus, loves Jesus and is with Jesus now and forever. Her faith and hope is now complete, her work is done, she has been a good and faithful servant, but more than that a child of our Father in heaven, who now resides with her brother and Savior Jesus and is fully wearing her crown of righteousness.

May we all trust and obey and worship our Jesus as "Milly Milly" displayed in her short earthly life!

We love you all and mourn with all of you our loss of Milly. But our loss is really our gain for we will be with her in heaven. What a joyful reunion that will be!
