Portal on Bundibugyo road. I took her with all her belongings in the ever faithful Pajero. The school does not have the teacher's houses, she rents two rooms and I paid her house rent for four months. We pray that her salary will be processed and paid soon. The district education officer has promised that in case there is any opening at Hope school he will transfer her back to Hope. By the way, the enrollment at Hope has gone up to 575 from the 430 last year. I reason it is the good constant performance of Hope. We miss Sarah for she is a very good teacher according to Headmaster Chris and she has also been teaching children at Sunday school at the church."

Sarah and her sister Betty are complete orphans. Sarah has watched over her younger sister for many years as she has overcome ulcers and takes regular medicine for the Aids virus. Her sister Betty will be graduating from Apollo Teachers College this year as a Good Samaritan student.
