In response to the growing number of sponsored children (PTL) we must limit the quantity of gifts per child per trip. To do this, we provide red drawstring bags for girls and blue for boys. - Small dictionary
- Soap (bar)
- Hard candies* (They love Sweet Tarts)

Larger items:

- Trousers or dresses
- Shirts or blouses
- Shoes or flip flops
- Sheets & pillow case (twin)
- Light blanket (twin)
- Towel & washcloth
- Books, age appropriate, inspirational & missionary, historic people
- Harmonica or recorder

⊘ Not allowed:

- F Liquids or lotions
- F Powdered drink mixes
- F Medications or vitamins
- F Cosmetics, nail polish
- F Candies that easily melt
- F Aerosol cans
- F Fragile items
- F War toys or knives
- F Camouflage clothing
- F Used or damaged items
- F Batteries & Items requiring batteries

***Vegetable seeds **must not be hybrid**. Ugandans save seeds for next planting. Hybrid seeds are specifically cross pollinated to produce a unique results. Some of the very best sweet corn is hybrid. Saved hybrid seed will not produce true the next season. But **non-hybrid** also called **heirloom seeds**, can be used year after year. Here are some suggestions: *

- Cabbage
- Bell peppers
- Egg plant
- Watermelon
- Tomatoes
- Cucumber
- Carrots

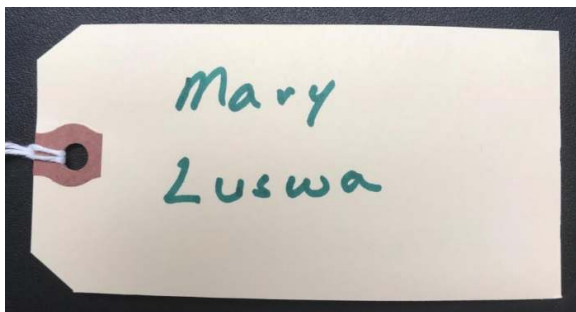

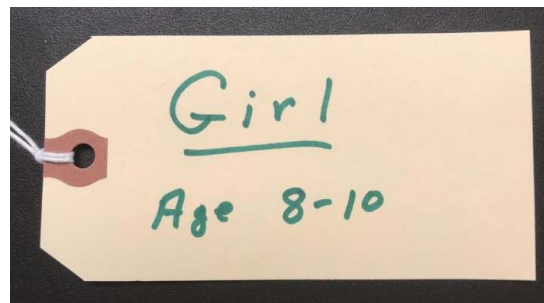
One of first bags distributed on our September 2018 trip, such a precious photo!
