This morning we saw post op patients both from cataract surgery and strabismus surgery. While many were healing slowly because of the types of procedures they had, there were no signs of major problems. Pray that as the cataract surgery patients go back to their village that they will not get infections. If they make it one week, they should be ok.

Drs. Enzenauer, Kim and Hoyt Lovelace went to the airport at noon. So the team for the next week will be Pastor Bob Hayes, Rachel Salvesson, and me. Additionally Miriam, a clinical officer (think physician's assistant) and Kosea, an ophthalmic nurse will be working at the guest house doing pre and post-operative exams. Depending on the need, we may also have another clinical officer named Baker.

Tomorrow morning I will again be teaching Sunday School and preaching the morning sermon at Calvary Presbyterian Church in Kiyoola. May God bless the proclamation of His Word. Pastor Bob Hayes will be preaching at Seeta-Nazigo and Morgan Lusk will be preaching at the worship service at Bethel Covenant College (Rashid's High School). Thomas DeMoss will also be sharing his testimony at Kiyoola.

As for the patient who walked away and never came back, we did not find him nearby, but the locals all seem to be confident that he would find his way back to his village. The patients who returned to his village were to look for him and report to us tomorrow. This afternoon I was blessed to have a lengthy nap and visit with Paula and Ian via FaceTime. They seem to be doing well except for Ian repeatedly asking me about coming home soon.
