This update was prepared Tuesday evening. I continue to be very busy plus today we had no electricity all day long.

Just a brief summary of our Sunday ministry. We left the guest house at 7:00 a.m. and traveled to the church plant at Nyanzi. It is supposed to be the very hot dry season but it rained for over three hours on Sunday. The church service was in a mud hut with a tin roof so preaching was difficult. This is the second church plant George Yawe has started and good progress is being made. A permanent building is under construction on land donated by one of the church members and the folks there doing most of the work.

After the service, we had a good meal of rice and chicken, with the chicken being cooked in banana leaves which seals so well it is like a pressure cooker.

When we finished eating, we traveled to Kyamagemule so the team members could see the work there. Construction on housing for the school teachers is making good progress.

The ride back to Kampala was an adventure. After the three hours of rain, we found ourselves on about 6 miles the muddiest roads I have ever traveled on. We finally got back at the guest house at 9:15 p.m.
